

NFNZ Accredited Fertility Educator Training Programme Guide

Certificate and Diploma of Fertility Education and Reproductive Health

2024-2026

Introduction

Natural Fertility NZ (NFNZ) is an non-profit organisation, that trains and equips educators to teach evidenced based fertility awareness based methods to individuals and couples, in particular:

- The sympto-thermal method (STM)
- Advanced guidelines for STM
- The lactational amenorrhea method (LAM) & fertility while breastfeeding

Educators are also prepared to present Continuing Medical Education (CME) to GP's, Midwives and Nurses, and to present community education sessions.

NFNZ supports its Accredited Educators through continued access to senior educators, monthly educator online meetings for chart discussion, facebook group for general discussion, and a number of grants (the details of the grants are made available after the organisation has secured their funding for the year - usually in January).

The full programme is taught over 36 months, which is divided into a Certificate & Diploma. You will start by obtaining the Certificate in the 1st year, and then if you choose to do so, the Diploma in the first semester of the 3rd year. The Diploma is not compulsory, and can be completed at any time when there is an intake (every 2 to 3 yrs). Some educators choose to wait a couple of years to build up their experience first.

While this programme is not NZQA accredited (not eligible for a Studylink student loan), it is highly respected, with NFNZ Educators registered to provide CME sessions for GP's, Midwives and Nurses.

Upon successful completion of the Programme, you will be awarded the 'Certificate in Fertility Education and Reproductive Health' and offered membership to NZNZ. While a member, you will be recognised as a NFNZ Accredited Educator and can access the many benefits of membership. This will help you as you begin your Fertility education business or add this knowledge to your current businesses services.

Application Details

Requirements and Preferred Skills

- Preferred entry to those with a primary health qualification (degree) such as: nursing, medicine, midwifery, doctor; qualification in complementary health disciplines such as: homoeopathy, naturopathy, medical herbalist.
- For those without a formal health qualification experience in teaching and/or working in the community with community groups, women, schools.
- Experience in business or current clinical practice and/or a drive to market yourself and your services after you have completed the programme.
- Literacy and study skills to support independent learning are a must. You will need to be competent using email, word processing programs, online learning platforms and have easy access to a computer with internet access to course content and to complete assignments.

Personal Attributes and Expectations of NFNZ Educators

NFNZ Educators work with clients who may be dealing with grief and significant challenges such as infertility or miscarriage. NFNZ requires Educators to show empathy and professionalism and as such expect a very high standard of behaviour and decorum from student's. Educators must also foster an attitude of equality, diversity, and cultural safety - respecting the Treaty of Waitangi and Maori health, and all relevant legislation.

You will be required to behave in a manner that the health consumer, other students and teachers determine as being culturally safe, respectful and to demonstrate the ability to apply the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi/Te Tiriti O Waitangi to your supervised practice component - which will be a reflection of your future practice.

Fees

NFNZ have finalised the details for 2024. The fee for the Certificate is \$4970.00, but there are scholarships available of \$1500.00 which will bring the fee down to \$3470. This scholarship has been made available by funding from the Public Trust. There are a few terms for this scholarship so please read the terms and conditions attached to this email.

To proceed, please read and sign the terms and conditions, and provide photo ID. Once this has been provided you will be emailed an invoice for a 10% non refundable deposit which will hold your place and secure your scholarship.

As we only enrol about a small number of students each course, this deposit must be paid within 7 days of us invoicing you, this is so we can keep places open for people to enrol in the course. This is really important as we don't want to reject enrollments due to being at capacity, then put the course at risk of postponement due to last minute withdrawals.

After you have paid your deposit, and If you would like to pay in instalments, you can set up weekly/monthly payments to our account. We will apply these to your invoice, these can start as soon as you have been enrolled and invoiced. It is advised to start these as early as you can to reduce payment amounts needed each time. Otherwise payment is due by the 12th of January 2024.

Additional costs may include:

- Travel, food and accommodations costs related to the Practicums in Christchurch and another North Island City (decided my the end of December) Will be either Auckland, Hamilton, or Palmerston North.
- Phone calls to your Course Facilitator and/or the National Clinical Supervisor
- Photocopying/printing costs of assignments as we always recommend that you keep a copy
- Costs relating to the development of your own teaching resources.
- Costs relating to resits of assignments and assessments

Teaching Locations

The theory component of the course is delivered using an online learning platform, where you will be able to access learning material, quizzes, communicate with trainers, and hand in assignments. All quizzes and assignments must be submitted by the due date. Quizzes/discussions are due weekly.

Online Meetings will be held using an online meeting platform, attendance at these will enhance your learning - all students are expected to take part.

Our 2 x 2 Day Intensive Practicums are part of 2 practicum months blocks. One at the mid to end of each semester. As well as an in person practicum weekend in each month, there are also various evening meetings and an Online Assessment for each. Please take note of the important dates below. Under no circumstances will any student be allowed to complete practicum weekend unless ALL prior assignments including any remedial work is completed, marked and passed beforehand.

The Supervised Practice component is completed after each practicum. It involves recording your appointments with a client, and submitting their charts, recordings and report for the Clinical Supervisor to Review.

Teaching Locations

The theory component of the course is delivered using an online learning platform, where you will be able to access learning material, quizzes, communicate with trainers, and hand in assignments. All quizzes and assignments must be submitted by the due date. Quizzes/discussions are due weekly.

Online Meetings will be held using an online meeting platform, attendance at these will enhance your learning - all students are expected to take part.

The 2 Day Intensive Practicum will be held online, usually on 2 Saturdays 1 week apart. You will participate in role play, chart interpretation and peer assessments. Please note the Practicum is compulsory. Under no circumstances will any student be allowed to attend any practicum unless ALL assignments including any remedial work is completed, marked and passed.

The Supervised Practice component is completed after the practicum. It involves reviewing your first 2 clients from each category with the Clinical Supervisor. This supervised practice is not formally assessed.
